





## **Guidelines / Regulations:**

A team must play in at least one of the qualifying tournaments to be eligible for the NSA Super Series Championships Event.

The Super Series Finals and qualifying tournaments will be a 5 games guarantee format, and team entry will be \$575.00 per qualifying tournament, and \$600.00 for the Championship Event.

In order to be eligible to play in a tournament, all players must be registered on the NSA Players Classification System. Once rosters are submitted there will be a review by the Super Series committee, and then approved for the event roster.

Ties will be broken as per the Official Tie Breaker Formula posted on the NSA website and the formula with be posted at the event also.

The event organizers reserve the right to move teams up/down divisions, in order to maintain fairness and equality of play.

Prize money is dependent upon number of teams that enter the events.

Player eligibility will be based on the PCS system that the Super Series has incorporated for fair play.

Rosters will model on NSA Ruling. 2 players of a 1 level higher can play down 1 division and 1 player of 2 levels higher can play down.

(Exemption: see below rule for intermediate).

Intermediate Co-ed Division will follow as the below capping for rosters:

20 players. All other players must be C/D/E.

A/B Womens will be reflected as a C ranking for co-ed INT play only.

Open Division rosters will be considered open to the extent of all A and B players are eligible to play plus and other players with lower ranking. (Please note if you choose to play Open your PCS ranking could be adjusted to reflect that).

Intermediate Mens Division will follow guideline of max 2 B or 1A ranked players and all other players must be under B ranked.

Rosters will be locked at a maximum of 20 players per team. A player cannot be on 2 different rosters of the same gender at the same time. If a player wishes to play with another team in another Super Series tournament, they must be dropped by their original team and added to their new team. A \$20.00 charge will apply to the new team that acquires the new player. A player can have a second transfer, but only back to his original team. This is to limit player movement from team to team.

The Super Series committee reserves the right to have the authority to overturn a player's ranking and roster to model and match the currently skill set for fair play.

The Super Series committee reserves the right to have the authority to make any decision that they feel is for the betterment of the tournament.

Line up cards must be submitted to umpires before the game and score sheets will be given to each team for every game. All line up cards must be handed into headquarters. If they are not turned in by the end of the round robin games, the score sheet and line up card for that game, will result in a forfeit for said team.

All rosters will be verified before Saturday and if there are any issues, the coach will be notified to amend.

All games The Super Series committee has the final say if the fields are unplayable. If both teams decide not to play the game, double default occurs and removal of prizing (cash and awards).

Matching jerseys or matching color shirts are acceptable for Super Series play. If a team does not have matching jerseys or shirts, said team will lose the rights to the coin toss and the opposing team has the option of taking home or away.

Player ejections – If a player is ejected from a game, they will be suspended for the next game in that division of play (All suspensions are subject to Event UIC's further discipline or reduction upon review)
