Turner Park, Hamilton, ON Men's and Women's Masters / Seniors Provincial Rules

The World Series starts Saturday and ends Sunday. There are 4 games guaranteed.

Finals will be played Sunday.

Equalizer Rule – Seniors divisions

The following equalizer rule will be in effect when or if Divisions combine during Round Robin play

Inning	Runs Awarded
1	2
2	2
3	2
4	1
5	1
6	0
7	0

This rule will be in effect only for the round robin portion of the tournament.

Rules:

- ☐ Two (2) game seeding rounds to seed elimination bracket
- ☐ Elimination bracket is a Double Knock-out format
- ☐ Home Runs - Five (5) per team per game. All home runs beyond 5 will be an out.
- ☐ Run Rules - Five (5) runs per inning maximum exception for the open inning
- ☐ Mercy Rule - 20 runs after the 3rd or 15 after the 4th inning and 10 runs after the 5th
- ☐ Time Limits
 - Round Robin – 75 - 90 minutes
 - Bracket Games – 75 - 90 minutes
 - Championship Games – 7 full innings
- ☐ Tie-breakers – Head to head (in full RR only), lowest runs allowed, true plus minus, coin toss
- ☐ 8-foot commitment line going home
- ☐ Safety line (scoring line) will be used for ALL Senior and Masters games
- ☐ Courtesy running – every player is allowed to run once per inning with no carry over (see Rule 8, Note 1, SENIOR)
- ☐ No bunting or stealing
- ☐ For example a player to be considered a 50-year old they must be 50 years of age as of December 31 of the current year and so on for all Master/Senior Divisions. (35+, 40+, 50+, 60+)
- ☐ Senior bats will be allowed in all Senior Divisions.
- ☐ Each Division is allowed 2 underage players but not more than 2 years under age as of December 31 of the current year.
- ☐ Prize money depends on the number of teams entered in each division.
